BIO

Based in his hometown of Victoria, BC, Russ is a realist painter, illustrator, and multidisciplinary designer. He is also an avid film-goer with a passion for movies, which have been a major source of inspiration for his art.

Russ is largely self-taught in artistic practice and technique, and his work is hand-drawn and painted using a variety of traditional mediums, including acrylics and coloured pencils.

He began exhibiting and selling his artwork in 2015, and many of his fine art paintings are now held in private collections across Canada. He was also awarded Best in Show at the 2017 Sidney Fine Art Show for his painting "Jazz for the Lonely."

Since 2021, Russ has merged his background in traditional fine arts with his love of cinema and has focussed on creating alternative movie posters and pop-culture-themed illustrations with a painterly approach.

He is now working on creating officially licensed movie, television, and sports-related artwork for entertainment brands, galleries, and publications. His work was recently published in Layered Butter's Stanley Kubrick Volume, and his La La Land artwork is now available as a collectible print to their subscribers. Prints of his movie posters can also be purchased through the Hero Complex Gallery in Los Angeles.

STATEMENT

My artwork is traditionally hand-drawn and painted with real materials, which I do because I love the physicality of making art.

I also hope this physical-world creativity and showing an artistic hand provides a bit of intrigue for viewers in this increasingly digital world.

The works on display here are examples of some of my movie-themed paintings and illustrations. Each work is an original design concept.

To create each piece, I start by watching the film to come up with an interesting thematic concept that tries to capture the spirit of the film – sometimes with just a single image of a character.

I carefully pick out visually interesting scenes, figures, and faces as reference images that will be tested and manipulated to form a composition that fits that concept. Sometimes, I have to invent imagery from scratch and may use myself as a model.

The composition is then sketched in pencil on illustration board, followed by a layer in acrylic paint and then finally a final textural layer in coloured pencils. Most of these original paintings are later digitized, and typography is added to create posters, Blu-ray box covers, or illustrations for publication.
